Small mammal trapping in the grounds of Churchill College, Cambridge, overnight from 10 October 2024 to 11 October 2024 - Peter Pilbeam, Emma Boland, several members of the College grounds staff, and several students.

Twenty (20) Longworth traps were set to catch with bedding (hay) and bait (muesli, diced apple and excess casters) at various locations (a small range of habitats) in a clockwise direction round the grounds from around 5pm on 10 October 2024 and checked from around 8am on 11 October 2024. Each animal caught was weighed and sexed. The animals were all released where caught - all the traps were then removed.

In summary, out of 20 traps there were 9 Wood Mouse, 1 Field Vole and 1 Bank Vole catches. This represents (of 20 trap sessions) an overall catch rate of 55%.

Trap 67 - pulled apart by a badger or a fox - both species known on site. The nest box part of the trap showed evidence (a small tunnel into the bedding) of having had a small mammal in it - it is surmised that whichever animal pulled the trap apart has been attracted to the trap by the small mammal (for an easy meal).

The weather overnight and when the traps were checked was clear, cold (down to 0 degrees/grass frost), and dry.
