ID Features:- Almost cat like face, short muzzle, large white whiskers, coat very variable in colour. Concave forehead and small nose, small nostrils which form a V shape almost meeting. Eyes often look sunken. More likely to be found in freshwater than grey seals. On land often lie in the 'banana' position.

Size:- 120-160cm

Weight:- 45-130kg

Distribution:- Mostly Scotland, Western Ireland but a few colonies along the east coast of England.

Mark Hows Cambridgeshire Mammal Group Grey Seal - Halichoerus grypus

ID Features:- A rather dog or even horse like face with a large muzzle, very large nostrils which are widely separated. A pronounced forehead with protruding eyes. Like common seals they are very variable in colour. Grey seals lie flat. Size:- 140-250cm Weight:- 130-440kg Distribution:- All of UK apart from some of the southern coast of England.
